SMU is the youngest local institution to have received accreditation from AACSB International for both its Accounting and Business programmes.

The SMU Bachelor of Accountancy (BAcc) has also been accredited and endorsed by the Institute of Singapore Chartered Accountants (ISCA), the Accounting and Corporate Regulatory Authority (ACRA), Singapore Accountancy Commission (SAC), CPA Australia, the Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ), the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW), the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (CIMA), the Institute of Management Accountants (IMA) and Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA).

Our graduates meet the entry requirements of these professional bodies for advancement towards a professional qualification locally and abroad.

Graduates Going Places

Our SoA graduates are well-equipped with the necessary skills and possess the resilience to build successful careers and/or pursue a postgraduate education beyond our shores.

Graduates who choose to further their studies have been accepted at postgraduate programmes in prestigious universities such as Harvard and Wharton. One of our alumni, Desmond Lim, completed his Masters at Harvard and proceeded to build his own start-up company QuikForce, an on-demand professional moving service based in the US.

Positive Employment Outcomes

The SMU BAcc is recognised as a hallmark of academic excellence by employers. Our graduates are highly sought after by major employers and on average, command higher starting salaries than their peers from other local institutions.

According to the SMU Graduate Employment Survey (GES) 2015, 97% of our graduates received job offers within six months of graduating. At close to 100% employment rate, more than half of our graduates joined the Big Four and other accounting firms, whilst the rest gained employment in banks, financial institutions as well as multinational corporations, consulting firms and government agencies.

With up to 14% higher average starting salaries according to GES 2015, SoA graduates continue the trend of commanding stronger mean starting salaries as compared to their peers from other local tertiary institutions.

We look for candidates who are able to work in teams and think critically rather than just accept instructions without questioning. I do see that SMU prepares its graduates really well in this area.

Hard Skills - A Rigorous Curriculum

The programme requires students to complete 36 modules that comprise of the Accounting Core, Accounting Options, Business Subjects, Foundation Courses and a broad-based group of courses (SMU University Core, Modes of Thinking, Globalisation, Asian Studies, General Education, Technology Studies and Entrepreneurship). In addition, students are required to complete a minimum of 10 weeks internship, a minimum of 80 hours community service, and the Finishing Touch Programme. The Finishing Touch Programme is one of SMU's distinguishing factors in honing its graduates throughout their BAcc programme towards career management and success through compulsory and optional workshops.

SMU-X

The recently launched SMU-X curriculum adopts a revolutionary approach to education by motivating students to master new skills and apply that knowledge in solving real-world problems.

All SMU-X courses are characterised by four principles: (i) inter-disciplinary content and activities, (ii) project-based learning via an actual problem/issue faced by an organisation, (iii) active student-mentoring by faculty and industry, and (iv) three-way learning by faculty, student and client, characterised by a tripartite sharing forum at the end of the course. In other words, for the undergraduates, every SMU-X course will combine academic with experiential learning through the heavy use of projects to challenge and inspire them to use their disciplinary knowledge and skills in tackling real multi-disciplinary issues faced by the partner organisations.

Students at SoA have the flexibility to finish the BAcc programme in 3, 3.5 or 4 years. With this freedom to plan your education, you can better maximise your learning journey here and graduate with much more than an accountancy degree:

- Gain breadth (Double Degrees and Second Majors) or depth (Accounting Tracks) to their education
- Draw local or overseas practical experience through internships, student leadership, community service or exchange programmes.

Students looking to further their postgraduate studies in top schools overseas, may find that taking four years to finish their BAcc degree in SoA opens more doors for them. For instance, certain top US Schools (e.g. HAAS School of Business, Berkeley and Yale School of Management) require international applicants to have at least four years of tertiary education to qualify for a number of their postgraduate programmes.

We are the first university in Singapore to offer tracks in the accounting programme for students who want to gain deeper insights within the specific accounting fields.



Accounting Tracks

You can choose from one of the four available accounting tracks — Financial Management Track, Risk Management & Assurance Track, Taxation Track and Data Analytics Track.

These tracks provide you with the opportunity to gain exposure in specialised fields that enhance your knowledge and career opportunities.

Financial Management Track:

This track will provide you the extensive knowledge to excel in accounting/ finance function in an organisation in fields such as commerce, finance, banking and consultancy.

Risk Management & Assurance Track:

This track equips you with specialised knowledge for assurance functions that are applicable to professional service firms and/or organisations.

Taxation Track:

This track focuses on an in-depth understanding of taxation functions that are applicable to a career in professional service firms and/or organisations.

Data Analytics Track:

This track provides you with extensive data analytics knowledge that enhances decision-making and complex problem-solving in accounting practices.

Double Degrees & Second Majors

You can add breadth to your learning by augmenting your accounting education with knowledge from other disciplines. Accountancy students can choose from up to 15 possible double degree combinations. Prospective students with outstanding academic results may apply for direct entry to the double degree programme. Our current students already enrolled in a single degree programme and who display exceptional results in their first or second year, can also opt for the double degree programme.

Alternatively, SMU BAcc students may elect for a second major to augment their accounting knowledge, from a choice of 37 possible second majors at any of the other five schools within SMU.

The majority of our students graduate with either a double degree or a second major which makes them more attractive to employers and provides more flexibility in their career choices. The broad-based skill set which you acquire also equips you with the versatility to ascend the corporate ladder in a variety of roles.

Our graduates have carved successful careers locally and internationally, within multiple industries that include accounting, investment banking, asset management, trading, consultancy, information technology and government bodies (e.g. Big Four, banks, Accenture, Singtel, Spring Singapore etc).

LEARN FROM OUTSTANDING FACULTY

Our world-class faculty are recognised as some of the best educators. Consistently clinching teaching and research excellence awards in SMU and internationally, they are at the forefront of accounting research and have strong connections with the accounting industry.



World-Class Faculty

Our faculty are recruited from renowned institutions around the world and have vast teaching and research experiences. The SoA faculty are also on the forefront of accounting research, clinching up to 20 SMU Research Excellence Awards since 2011. Many of them also serve in the editorial committees or as reviewers in top academic journals such as Journal of Accounting and Economics, Journal of Accounting Research, The Accounting Review, Review of Accounting Studies and Contemporary Accounting Research.

Through their efforts, SoA has achieved international recognition for its high quality research and ranks 1st in Asia and 3rd in the world, in Archival Accounting Research (All Topics), according to the Brigham Young University (BYU) Accounting Research Rankings (February 2017).

Strong Industry Backgrounds

To add real-world business perspectives to SoA's dynamic educational experience, we count top industry practitioners with a wealth of industry experience as part of our faculty.

Teaching Innovations

Our SoA faculty members also enhance the learning experience for students by developing teaching innovations and unique learning tools that complement textbook learning with experimentation and application. From developing an interactive app which teaches accounting concepts – the Accounting Challenge (ACE) app, to the use of Digital Storytelling in a multimedia learning tool "Movies-Door-2-Door.Com", our faculty take the lead in developing innovative pedagogies in accounting education to augment classroom learning.

Award-Winning Faculty

Our faculty have consistently performed well at the annual SMU Teaching Excellence (TE) Awards, clinching more than 20 awards since 2005. Some of our faculty have clinched multiple TE awards in their careers as well.

In 2016, Associate Professor (Education) Gary Pan, who serves as Academic Director for SMU-X, was awarded the bronze medal in the Discipline Awards in the area of Arts & Humanities at the internationally acclaimed QS-Wharton Reimagine Education Awards 2016.

In 2015, our faculty at SoA also made history as the first professors of a university outside of America to clinch the prestigious 2015 Innovation in Accounting Education Award from the American Accounting Association (AAA). This adds to the list of internationally acclaimed teaching and pedagogical awards clinched by our professors such as the CEEMAN Champion Awards and the Bea Sanders/AICPA Teaching Innovation Award (Honorable Mention).

Lessons come alive when professors share their professional experiences together with academic theories. One professor I studied under was the former Auditor-General of Singapore. He shared so many stories that never failed to captivate the class and effectively taught us the skills needed to make professional judgments.

Professors at SoA actively engage in research collaborations with our industry partners addressing key industry-related issues. A number of these projects have generated much industry interest, and have since spun off into related studies that tap into the key research findings submitted by our faculty. Some of the latest projects include:

- Associate Professor (Education) Gary Pan and Assistant Professor Kevin Ow Yong, with co-authors Lim Chu Yeong and Jeffrey Ng, published the report "In Fair Value We Trust, Or Not", which was released on 25 August 2016. The research project was a collaboration with the Institute of Singapore Chartered Accountant (ISCA) and Institute of Valuers and Appraisers of Singapore (IVAS).
- Associate Professor (Practice) Themin Suwardy worked with ACRA to develop the ACRA Audit Quality Indicators (AQIs) Disclosure Framework released in November 2015.



REAL-WORLD READINESS

Pro-active involvement in the vibrant student life on campus allows students to hone their leadership potential and qualities, while internships let them gain real-world perspectives and discover new insights on their career choices.



Internships

Students are required to complete 10 weeks of internship experience and our SoA students recognise the valuable opportunity to experience working life before graduation.

A special internship window from December to February – the peak period in the accounting industry – gives students first-hand experience of a career in the accounting industry.

On average, SoA students complete between two to six internships, often in different companies and across multiple industries, to identify the best job fit. SoA students may also pursue internships in overseas companies for a broader and more diverse working experience.

Many of our students have performed well at their internships and are offered jobs by their companies even before graduation.

Finishing Touch Programme

The Finishing Touch course has a variety of workshops on etiquette, image and interview skills among others, to groom our graduates into confident bright young minds prepared for the professional world.

Given the flexibility in course planning in SMU, I am able to do various internships and explore different career paths, ranging from the accounting profession to operations management and investment research. I am thankful for these first-hand experiences as they have definitely deepened my understanding of the professions and their working culture. Apart from learning more about the professions and industries, these internship experiences have also allowed me to better evaluate my preferred career choices.

Overseas Exchange Programme

Studying overseas can have positive impact on a student's personal and professional growth as it provides students with an enriching cultural and academic experience like no other. All exchange applicants will be assured of a placement in a university abroad. Since 2010, more than 50% of each BAcc cohort has gone on overseas exchange. Our list of partner universities for exchange currently exceed 220, and cover different regions and continents.

SMU gave me a lot of opportunities to grow outside of the classroom which greatly enhanced the learning experiences that I had in my four years as a student in SMU. The practical experience from internships and the global exposure, through overseas exchange, the accounting study mission and also through community service projects, really made me a lot more marketable to employers.
